Getting there


Please follow the below guidance to the ticket collection point as advised by the FAI and An Garda Síochána (the Irish police).

To Ticket Collection and Parking:

From the M1 enter the Port Tunnel.

Exit the Port Tunnel (toll charges apply) in the direction of the Tom Clarke Bridge (East Link) and through the East Link Toll.

At the end of the East Link Toll enter the roundabout and take the third exit on to South Bank Road where bus and car parking, and ticket collection is located on Sean Moore Road, Ringsend, D6.



To Aviva Stadium (1.1 miles)

From the ticket collection point, walk up Sean Moore Road across Tritonville Road and onto Bath Avenue. Follow the signage for Red Route entry point.

Ticket collection

Ticket Collection will take place before the match on Thursday 15 November from 3pm – 7pm. In order to collect your ticket, you will need to produce the following documentation.

- Collection Voucher
- Valid Campaign Card
- Photo ID

ALL TICKETS ARE TO BE COLLECTED ON AN INDIVIDUAL BASIS ONLY. NO GROUP COLLECTION WILL BE PERMITTED.

PLEASE ARRIVE EARLY TO AVOID DELAYS.

Fans will be located in Section I of the Aviva Stadium. Please enter the stadium via the Red Route.

Fan Behaviour

All fans must comply with directions from An Garda Síochána and stewards, and respect local residents' property.

Verbal abuse towards staff or volunteers will not be tolerated at any time.

Entry to the stadium may be refused in any case where behaviour is deemed inappropriate.

- Banners with two poles
- Laser pointers and selfie sticks
- Video cameras
- Paper rolls
- Megaphones
