Getting there: ESTONIA

Gathering place for Northern Ireland fans

It is anticipated fans will gather in the Townhall Square in the Old Town area of Tallinn.

Townhall Square and the adjacent area has a large number of bars, cafes and restaurants.

Those choosing to avail of public transport (buses and trams) should walk to nearby Freedom Square and utilise buses and trams from there to Lillekula Stadium (A Le Coq Arena).

Getting from Freedom Square to A Le Coq Arena by public transport

Option 1 (see map on page 4)

FROM FREEDOM SQUARE BY BUS ALONG ENDLA STREET

This route may be closed to traffic by local police to allow fans to walk to the stadium.

Get on bus 23 and 23A at Freedom Square and get off at Koidu bus stop. Walk about 10 -15 mins towards stadium. In red – travel by bus; blue dots – walking.

Option 2 (see map on page 4)

BY TRAM FROM FREEDOM SQUARE ALONG PÄRNU MAANTEE AVENUE

Get on Tram 3 or 4 at Freedom Square. Either tram runs along Pärnu Maantee Avenue. Get off at the Vineeri stop and walk to the stadium (10 mins) or Tallinn-Väike and walk to the stadium. In green – travel by tram; blue dots – walking.

A plastic smartcard and e ticket system is in use in Tallinn for buses, trolleybuses and trams. Information can be obtained on the Tallinn Tourism Website www.tourism.tallinn.ee.

Those fans wishing to walk to the stadium will be advised by local police as to the preferred route. This will entail a 30-40 minute walk from Freedom Square.

Entry to stadium

There will be an initial soft ticket check at the outer perimeter of the stadium followed by a search and scanning of ticket at the turnstiles.


Northern Ireland fans will enter the stadium at Gate 7 and are seated in the top storey of the stand in sectors 15-18.

Prohibited items are the same as those at the National Football Stadium in Belfast. While there is some provision for large bags to be stored, none of these items will be admitted to the stadium.

Anyone wishing to display banners or flags is encouraged to bring them to the stadium two hours before kick-off.


Alcohol is on sale at the stadium but not permitted to be brought to the spectator areas.

Useful information

Tallinn is a city well used to an influx of foreign visitors and offers a range of activities focusing on the Old Town part of the city.

Be aware of the risk of pickpocketing and mugging especially in bars and nightclubs in Tallinn's Old Town.

You should report any theft in person to Tallinn Central Police Station, Kolde, Tallinn **+372 612 5400**. You will need to obtain a police report if you have lost your passport.

You should take out comprehensive travel and medical insurance before you travel and ensure you are in possession of the European Health Insurance Card. The currency of Estonia is the euro.

VISA REQUIREMENTS AND OTHER INFORMATION PRIOR TO TRAVEL

Strict attention must be paid to the travel advice on the FCO website. Go to **www.fco.gov.uk** and follow the links to Belarus.

This advice is especially important to fans who are considering alternative travel arrangements to the direct flights from Tallinn to Minsk International Airport. Travel to other points of entry in Belarus may entail additional visa requirements.

Travel via Russia may require an appropriate visa even if you are only transiting through an airport.

Details listed on travel documentation must be exactly the same as your passport details or you will be challenged at the point of entry.

Your passport will be thoroughly checked at the point of entry and must be free from blemishes/damage.

You will be required to purchase obligatory medical insurance prior to passing through Passport Control. The cost is two euro for three days' cover.

Belarus Roubles can only be purchased in Belarus via ATMs or official money exchange points. Only good quality pound or euro notes free from damage or blemishes will be accepted.

MEETING POINT FOR FANS

While the game is being played in Borisov it is recommended fans gather in Minsk and only travel to Borisov pre match.

Northern Ireland fans are advised to meet up in the Zybitskaya district of Minsk. There is ample space in this area with access to bars, cafes and restaurants.

Drinking in public areas is not permitted.

TRAVEL TO STADIUM


The match is being staged at Borisov Arena. The travel time by coach from Minsk is approximately one hour and 20 minutes.

While there is public transport via rail between the two cities no guarantees have been obtained regarding public transport back to Minsk after the match. Please note the stadium is outside the city of Borisov and a considerable distance from the railway station.

Fans are encouraged to travel from Minsk to Borisov via pre organised coaches.

All coaches arranged by fans travelling to Borisov should leave Lenin Street in Minsk at 1845 on match day (nearest Metro station is Pershamayskaya).

STADIUM

Prior to entry all fans will be subjected to a ticket check, search and scanning of ticket.

Northern Ireland fans will be seated in Sector G1 and G2 of the stadium.

Details of prohibited items are displayed at the stadium entrance and there should be spare capacity to display flags and banners.

USEFUL INFORMATION

All persons travelling to Belarus are strongly advised to take out comprehensive medical and travel insurance.

You should avoid taking photographs of government buildings, military installations and uniformed officials. You can be fined for jaywalking.
