Belfast is a city of buzzing culture and industrial prowess. Whether you are exploring the bars and restaurants of the Cathedral Quarter or visiting the birthplace of the world's most famous ship, there is something for everyone in Northern Ireland's dynamic capital city.

Getting to Belfast

Villarreal fans are travelling to/from this year's UEFA Super Cup on charter flights, adhering to strict Covid protocols, however here's a guide for Chelsea fans who will be travelling to the match from Britain:

Belfast is easily accessed by sea with crossings from both Scotland and England. Travel by state of the art superfast ferries from Scotland with journey times circa two hours.

Getting around Belfast

Belfast is compact and bijou, so getting around the city is easy on foot, by bike or by taxi. However, if you want to wander a little further afield there's a network of transport options which will get you to your desired destination.

BY BUS AND TRAIN

Translink is Northern Ireland's public transport provider.

Metro and Glider bus services operate in the Belfast area, with Ulsterbus and Goldline bus services connecting the rest of Northern Ireland. Go to translink.co.uk for further information, including timetables for coaches to/from the airports.

Translink also operates Northern Ireland Railways which connects Belfast to various cities and towns in Northern Ireland.

Tickets are available from the driver on the day of travel, from main bus and train stations or Glider ticket vending machines at halts and can also be purchased via the Translink app using Google Pay or Apple Pay.

Within Belfast the main train stations are Great Victoria Street Station and Lanyon Station (previously known as Belfast Central Station).

Passengers are reminded to use hand sanitisers at stations and cashless payments. Face coverings must also be worn onboard buses and trains and within stations.

UEFA Super Cup 2021 entry requirements for fans

We look forward to welcoming fans from Chelsea FC and Villarreal CF to the National Football Stadium at Windsor Park in Belfast on Wednesday 11 August.

We want you to enjoy the game safely and responsibly so please read the following ahead of entry to fully enjoy what we are sure will be a memorable night for Belfast - and football in Northern Ireland.

For fans from within the UK aged 11 and over, you must have available on request:

- 1. Proof of full vaccination by showing your Covid-19 Vaccination Card that was issued to you when you received your vaccinations; you must also show valid Photographic ID matching the name on your vaccination card.
- other government issued proofs of full vaccination are also acceptable, provided you also produce valid Photo ID.
- your proof of vaccination must reflect that you have had both doses and that your second dose was administered at least 14 days prior to the game.
- 2. If you cannot demonstrate that you have received both doses you will need to show proof of a negative COVID test as follows:
- NHS lateral flow test taken no more than 48 hours prior to your arrival at the stadium; you report your result online at www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests and have available your NHS email or text notification of your result.
- Proof of a negative PCR test taken no more than 72 hours prior to arrival at the stadium.
- 3. Alternatively, you can also gain entry by demonstrating proof of natural Covid antibodies based upon a positive PCR test within 180 days of the game (including 10 days self-isolation following the result).

For fans from outside the UK aged 11 and over, you must have available on request:

- 1. Proof of full vaccination through an EU Digital Covid Certificate (EU DCC) for Europe or a CDC card for the USA.
- 2. Proof of a negative PCR test taken no more than 72 hours prior to arrival at the stadium or lateral flow test taken no more than 48 hours prior to your arrival at the stadium.
- 3. Alternatively, you can also gain entry by demonstrating proof of natural Covid antibodies based upon a positive PCR test within 180 days of the game.

Under Belfast City Council bye-laws, on-street drinking (of alcohol) is prohibited in designated areas of the city and those caught drinking in the streets could potentially face a fine of up to £500.

The designated areas where on-street drinking (of alcohol) is prohibited feature appropriate signage.

Justice Act (Northern Ireland) 2011

The Police Service of Northern Ireland and the Public Prosecution Service are committed to taking a robust stance towards tackling football-related disorder and hooliganism.

The legislation in Northern Ireland (the Justice Act (NI) 2011) creates offences to promote good behaviour by fans of football, to ensure the match day experience is a positive one for all those attending. This includes:

- Unauthorised pitch incursion
- · Offensive chanting
- Missile throwing
- Possession of flares or fireworks
- Possession of alcohol on hired buses en route to regulated matches.

These are in addition to other more conventional offences.

The legislation also introduces 'Football Banning Orders' for the purpose of helping to prevent violence and disorder at Association Football Matches.

The Police Service of Northern Ireland will seek banning orders for any individuals involved in football related disorder. In the event of a conviction a Court will be able to make a banning order, prohibiting a person from attending Football Matches. The duration of the Football Banning Order will be determined by the Court and reflect the circumstances of the offending.

It is a Criminal Offence to fail to comply with a Football Banning Order.

The Police Service of Northern Ireland work closely alongside the United Kingdom Football Policing Unit. The details of any nationals resident in the United Kingdom, identified as involved in disorder, will also be shared with their relevant Law Enforcement Agency.



Public Processions (Northern Ireland) Act 1998

A person proposing to organise a public procession, or 'Fan Walk', in Northern Ireland shall give notice of that proposal either by,

- Sending it to the Police Service of Northern Ireland by permitted electronic means, or
- In person, by leaving it with a member of the Police Service of Northern Ireland, not below the rank of Sergeant, at the Police Station closest to the starting point of the procession.

Notice shall be given not less than 28 days prior to the date on which the fan walk will be held or, if that is not reasonably practical, as soon as it is practical to do so.

Any person who organises or takes part in a public procession, or 'Fan Walk', where proper notice has not been satisfied shall be guilty of an offence and be liable for prosecution.






